ORDINANCE


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

Section 1. Chapter 9-64 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by adding a new section 9-64-112 and by inserting the language underscored, as follows:

- 9-64-110 **Parking is prohibited – Roadways, sidewalks, bridges and similar locations.**  
It shall be unlawful to stand or park any vehicle in any of the following places:
  - (a) **On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;**
  - (b) **Within an intersection, except on the continuous side of a "T" intersection;**
  - (c) **On a crosswalk;**
  - (d) **On a sidewalk, except as provided in section 9-64-112 (b);**
  - (e) **On a parkway, except in case of an emergency or except as provided in section 9-64-112(b);**
  - (f) **Upon any bridge, except those located on North Stockton Drive between North Avenue and Diversey Parkway;**
  - (g) **In a viaduct or underpass;**
  - (h) **On any railroad tracks or within a distance of ten feet from the outer rails thereof.**

- 9-64-112 **Two-wheel on-curb parking zones.**
  - (a) **Subject to the approval of the city council, the commissioner of transportation is authorized to establish two-wheel on-curb parking zones in any block of any residential two-way street and to designate such zones by placing and maintaining suitable signs or markings when all of the following requirements are met:**
    - (1) **the width of the two-way street in the proposed two-wheel on-curb parking zone is not more than 30 feet;**
    - (2) **vehicles can be parked on both sides of the proposed two-wheel on-curb parking zone; and**
    - (3) **the establishment of the proposed two-wheel on-curb parking zone is necessary to maintain sufficient width of the roadway for free movement of vehicular traffic.**
  - (b) **Notwithstanding subsections 9-64-110 (d) and (e) of Section 9-64-110 of this Code, any person may stand or park a vehicle with two wheels on the curb on both sides of a two-wheel on-curb parking zone.**

Section II. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and approval.
